

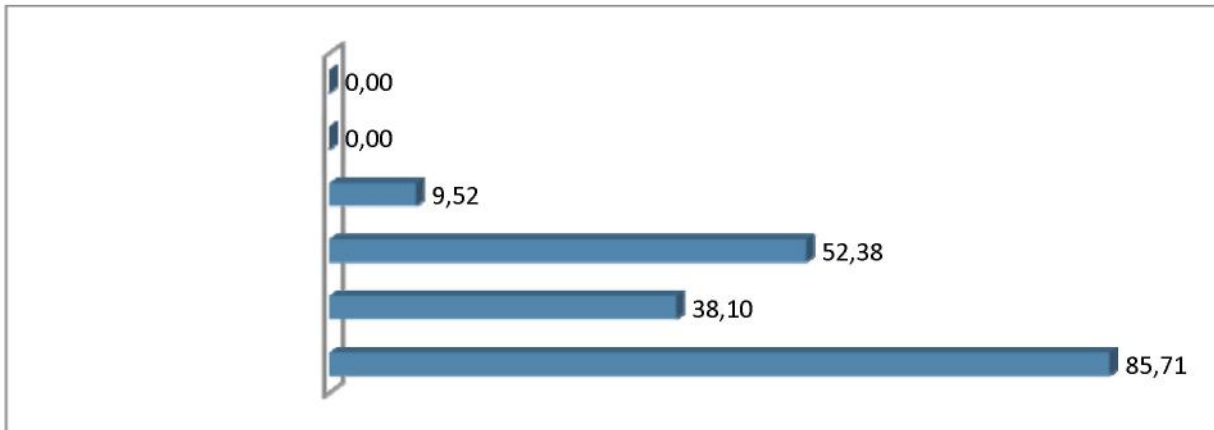
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CONCLUSIONS OF THE LOCAL WORKSHOP DATED 17 AND 24 MARCH 2012

1- To what extent has the SUSTAIN Project Two-Day local workshop (17-24 March 2012) met your expectations?

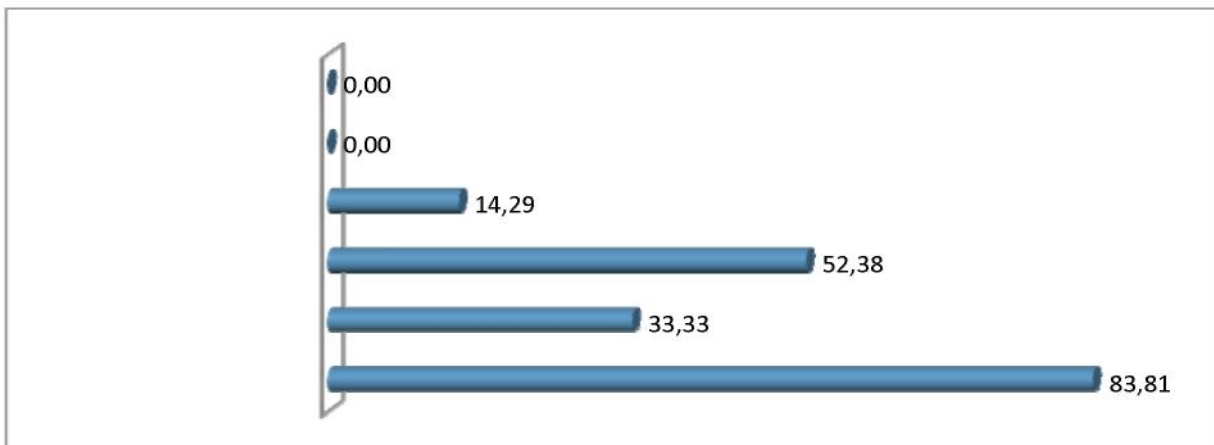
Results diagram is presented below:



Around 85.72% of the teachers participating in the workshop stated that the Local workshop met their expectations.

2- To what extent do you think this those you have learned in the workshop will benefit your future professional life?

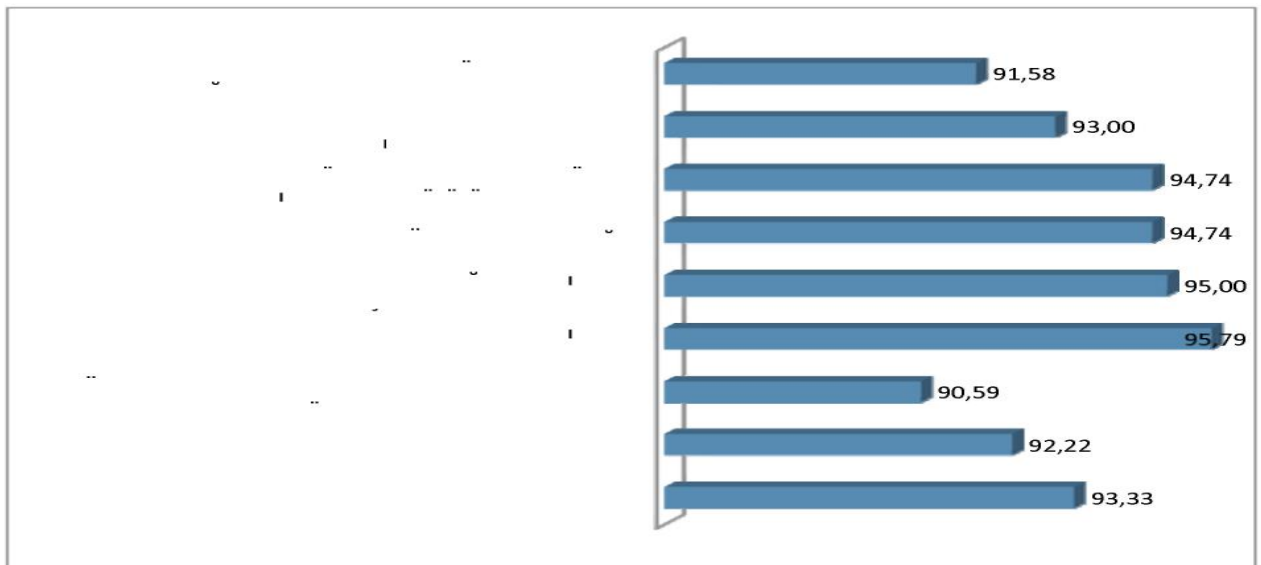
Results diagram is presented below:



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- 83.81% of the teachers participating in the workshop on average believe that those they have learned in the Local Workshop will be beneficial in their professional life in the future.

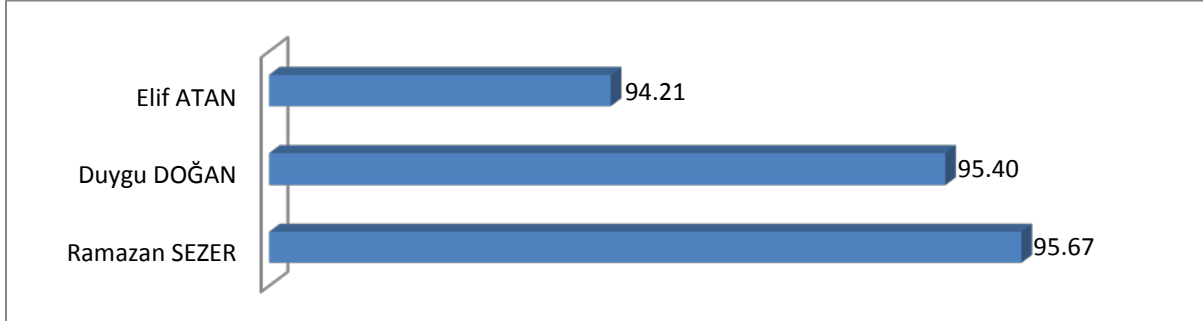
3- Which of the below mentioned contents do you think will be beneficial for your profession?



- Teachers participating in the workshop have assessed the following as beneficial for the profession: communicating with teachers from other branches and campuses (91.58%), project website and platform introduction (93%) (Given by the Romanian expert Gabriel Gorghiu), discussion and Question and Answer session (94.74%) (conducted with the project coordinators and experts), group work (94.74%) (example lesson plan), Example lesson by Duygu Doğan (95%), Example lesson by Ramazan Sezer (95.79%), case study on Science, music, social sciences and pre-school subjects (90.59%), methodological subjects an interactive activities on terms (92.22%) (matching, dictation by running) and case study (93.33%).

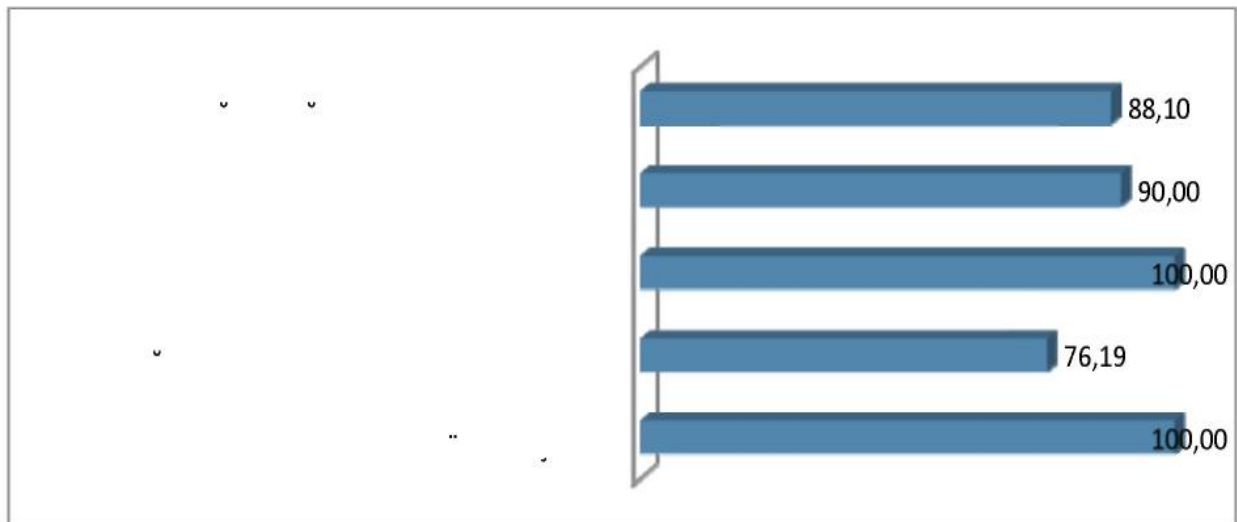
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4- Please assess the performance of course trainers according to the below criteria.



- In the workshop, trainers have been assessed by the participants with regard to knowledge of contents, innovative content, preparation for the lesson, sensitivity to the needs of participants, ability to create a comfortable and motivating learning environment and using effective teaching methods and techniques. As a result of this assessment, participants have assessed Ramazan SEZER at 95.67%, Duygu DOĞAN at 95.40% and Elif ATAN at 94.21% as per the stated criteria.

5- Assess the success of SUSTAIN Project Two-Day Local Workshop (17-24 March 2012) with regard to the stated criteria.



- Participants have rated two-day workshop: used training materials 88.10%, use of BIT 90%, applied activities 100%, time allocated for completing the activities 76.19% and application and administration balance of the program 100%.

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6- Which lesson/lessons or activity/activities have you liked the most during the course?

- During the course 57.1% of the participants stated that they liked Romanian lesson, drama show Science and Technology Pickle Making Lessons, 9.5% Drama Show, Introduction of Web common Platform (Gabi) and Powerpoint presentations and finally 33.4% all the lessons and activities.

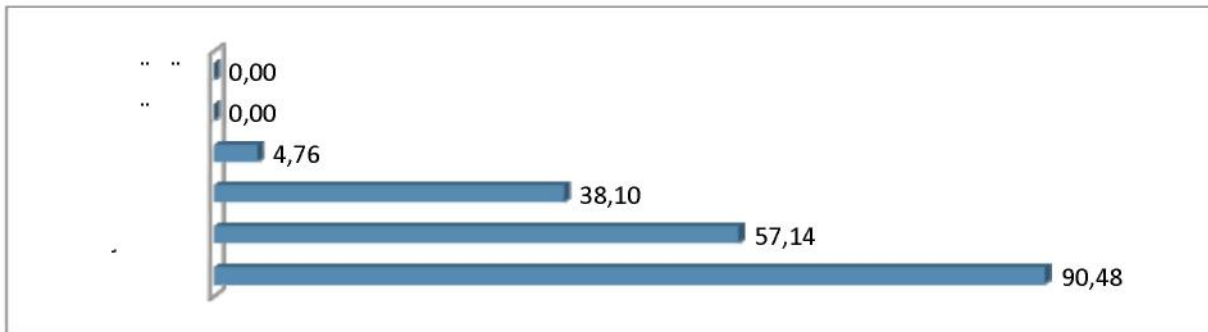
7- Which lesson/lessons or activity/activities didn't you like during the course?

- 71.3% of the participants have not stated any problems, 28.7% have stated that they did not like the time planning (overtime), lesson preparation in a group, problems in interpreting the foreign expert and pickle making lesson plan.

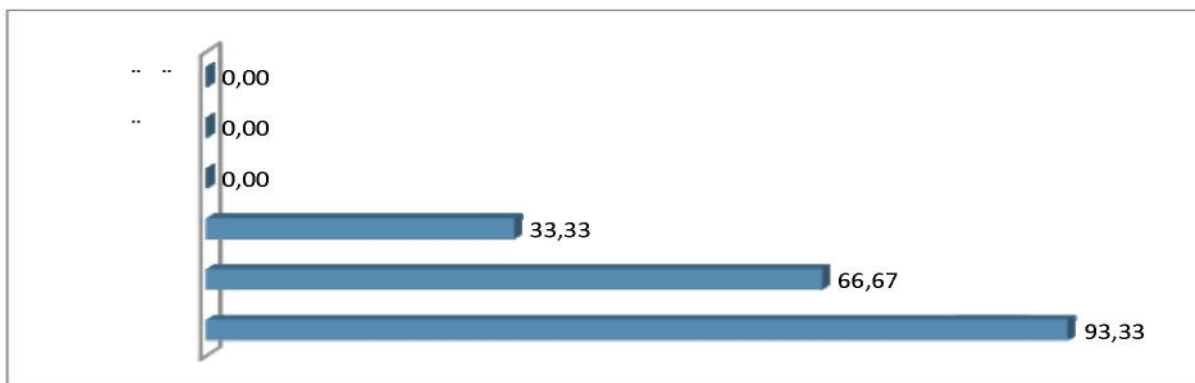
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8- How do you rate the course in general? (Please consider the contents and organization of the course)



- Participants state that they have found the workshop successful at 90.48% .

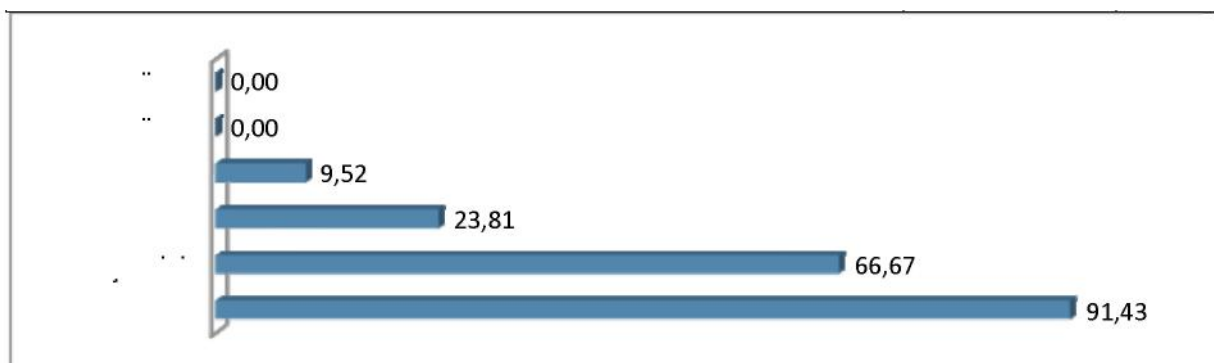
9- What extent would you recommend this workshop to your colleagues?



- In this study, participants stated that they would recommend this workshop for your colleagues at 93.33% on average.

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10- Assess the workshop with regard to location, food service and provision of materials.



- The general view of participants is that the location, food service and provision of materials in the two-day workshop were 91.43% successful on average.

11- Are there any other issues or recommendations you would like to mention on the contents and organization of the workshop?

- 19% of the participants have stated that the workshop environment could have been better, and 4.8% said that the time planning could have been better. In addition, while 47.6% of the participants did not make any recommendations, 28.6% have provided positive feedback.

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GENERAL REMARKS

According to the general assessment of the data acquired at the end of the workshop organised on 17 and 24 Mart 2012 with the participation of 21 teachers and 6 educators, the participants stated that the Local Workshop met their expectations and those they learned in the workshop would be useful in their future professional lives.

Considering the data acquired from the participants, it is seen that teachers find the discussion and question and answer session conducted for the lesson applications and deficiencies with the project coordinators and experts, useful. In addition, it has been observed that teachers wish to make an interdisciplinary correlation in the lesson plans more easily and contact teachers from other branches and campuses. Moreover, teachers find it more attractive to be included in the example lesson application, case study, interactive activities on methodological subjects and terms (matching, dictate by running) relating to the lessons compared to solely explanation as they ensure that the teachers are more dominant in the process. Furthermore, the case study prepared with quotations from various classes is professionally beneficial. The fact that pre-school and form teachers are eager to use and reach good examples in using information technology, has ensured that they have been interested in the presentation on the project website and platform by Romanian expert Gabriel Gorghiu.

Majority of the participants find the implementation and administration balance of the program with the used materials, use of computer technology and applied activities and therefore they will recommend the training for their colleagues. Moreover, the participants have shared their recommendations for a better study environment and time planning in a future workshop, and it has been shared with the project experts that these recommendations should be taken into consideration in the next workshop.
